

FIRST CIRCULAR

XX Annual Meeting of the European Association of Vertebrate Palaeontologists









WELCOME!

Dear friends and colleagues,

On behalf of the convenors and the Organizing Committee, it is my pleasure to warmly invite you to attend the XX Conference of the EAVP, which will be hosted by the Institut Català de Paleontologia Miquel Crusafont (ICP) in Sabadell (Catalonia, Spain) during June 26th – July 1st, 2023. Although the exact conference site within the city of Sabadell has yet to be determined, we open in this circular the call for roundtables, workshops, and symposia on specific topics.

The ICP is a public research center of the CERCA system (Research Centers of Catalonia), funded by the Catalan government (Generalitat de Catalunya) and linked to the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB). One of its two headquarters is located within the UAB campus in Bellaterra (Cerdanyola del Vallès), while the other (where its museum exhibit and collections are housed) is situated in the center of Sabadell. The organization of an international meeting such as the EAVP Conference perfectly aligns with the mission of the ICP, which consists in performing research in vertebrate and human paleontology at an international level while promoting the conservation and dissemination of the paleontological heritage from Catalonia.

Even though the ICP was refounded in its present form in 2006, it has much deeper roots far back in time and owes its existence to Miguel Crusafont-Pairó-the father of the Catalan school of vertebrate paleontology. Initially based at the former City Museum of Sabadell, since the early 1940s Crusafont amassed an impressive collection of fossil vertebrates and performed a meteoric career as a paleontologist, which ultimately led to the establishment of the Instituto Provincial de Paleontología of Sabadell (the ICP's predecessor) in 1969. Crusafont held incredibly modern views by the standards of his time, not only regarding research topics (by adhering to a paleobiological approach inextricably linked to evolution) but also the way of making research (by emphasizing team working and international collaboration). Fully aware of the importance of establishing an extensive network of international collaborators, Crusafont not only visited the most renowned European paleontologists of his time (beginning with his first international tour in 1946), but further invited them to gather in Sabadell during the four successive editions of the Cursillos Internacionales de Paleontología (International Short Courses in Paleontology), a series of international workshops that he organized during the 1950s.

As heirs of this Crusafontian tradition that emphasizes international collaboration and networking, the ICP could not miss the opportunity to engage in the organization of an EAVP Conference. I am sure this will be an excellent opportunity to disseminate paleontological knowledge, exchange novel ideas, and establish new collaborations or consolidate pre-existing ones—as it is always the case of EAVP meetings.

I therefore hope that you will be able to attend the meeting and look forward to seeing you in Sabadell. May you have a peaceful and productive end of the year!

FIELD TRIPS

EAVP attendees will be able to choose at least two different fieldtrips from three different options:

- 1) Field trip to the Permian terrestrial succession of the Catalan Pyrenees.
- 2) The Miocene high-resolution record of the Vallès-Penedès Basin (Catalonia).
- 3) The Cretaceous ecosystems of the south-Pyrenean basins.

Option 1 will be offered on Monday June 26th, and options 2 and 3 will be offered simultaneously on Saturday July 1st (see preliminary program above). More information on the routes and prices will be provided soon on our website eavp2023.icp.cat.

HOW TO GET TO SABADELL

Sabadell is one of the largest cities in Catalonia and is located just 20 km north of Barcelona. For this reason, the easiest way to get there is to travel first to Barcelona and then to Sabadell. There are many combinations to get to Sabadell from Barcelona, but here we propose some of the easiest options:

- From the Josep Tarradellas Barcelona - El Prat Airport:

The best option is to take the Aerobús (A1 if you arrive to T1 or A2 if you arrive to T2; **check departure times and fares here**) to the center of Barcelona (Plaça Catalunya).

Once at Plaça Catalunya, you may take the train of Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat de Catalunya (FGC line S2; check departure times and fares here) that will take you directly to Sabadell city center (Sabadell Plaça Major station). Note that in Google Maps the location of the stations in Plaça Catalunya are imprecise, and therefore we recommend you to use this map:



The whole trip from Barcelona airport to Sabadell city center using the Aerobús and the Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat de Catalunya should take from one and a half to two hours.

A cheaper, but somewhat slower way: In Terminal T2 of Josep Tarradellas-El Prat airport, take the train of Rodalies de Catalunya (RENFE line R2N; **check departure times and fares here**) to "Barcelona-Sants". In case your flight lands in Terminal 1, there are free shuttle buses to go from Terminal 1 to Terminal 2. See next option on how to continue your trip from Barcelona-Sants to Sabadell.

- From Barcelona-Sants Train Station:

Take the train of the RENFE line R4 towards Terrasa or Manresa to the station "Sabadell Centre".

To go from Barcelona to Sabadell you must buy the 2-zones ticket, either if you take RENFE or FGC trains.

ACCOMMODATION

The city center and ICP museum are located in the commercial center of Sabadell, which is full of restaurants, bars, and shops. Furthermore, there is a good number of emblematic modernist style buildings.
